



But before reaching on any conclusion, let us read the Section 11 of the Aircraft Act, 1934





So, what, this section is apply to Aircrafts only and not to kites. 2 2

Please be cautious $\Delta \Delta \Delta$ Δ and read the below provision $\widehat{\Psi}$

Section 2 (1) of the Act defines the "Aircraft" as 'Any machine which can derive support in the atmosphere from reactions of the air, a [other than reactions of the air against the earth's surface] and includes balloons, whether fixed or free, airships, kites, gliders and flying machines'.

Thus, Aircraft includes kites and balloons as well.

Conclusively if a person harms someone flying kites, he or she can be booked under section 11 of the Aircraft Act.
